3-4-09

The sky this morning was amazing! It started out 6 oktas full of wispy cirrostratus clouds that formed a patchy blanket of clouds across the sky, and fluffy cumulus clouds. But then things changed, as they invariably do, and the clouds began to morph into new and interesting shapes. I saw one cloud that looked like hair. The wind must be blowing pretty hard up there, but it isn't down here, as I was only able to record 4 mph from the North East. The air pressure is 30.39 inHg, the humidity is 35% and the temperatures are 34.6°F and 1.4°C, which is pretty warm considering the temperatures we had earlier this week.

This morning we saw some turkey vultures which soared overhead, riding the air currents. We also heard what may have been a Red-tailed Hawk, but we're not sure.
