I stepped out the door this morning into a world of mist and stratus clouds. The stratus clouds were very low and covered all 8 oktas of the sky, and then stretched down to the ground and swallowed everything up with mist. You truly could not see more than a few feet ahead of you! The wind speed was 1.5 mph from the North North West, barely enough to stir the mist up. The humidity is 98%, which explains the mist, and the temperatures are 44.6°F and 7°C. The air pressure is 29.86. It is cold and clammy outside.

We saw some Mourning Doves, a Red-Bellied Woodpecker and some sparrows courting (and in the case of the males, fighting!). We also heard a cardinal.
