

THE WOOLLY RHINOCEROS:

Characteristics:

The Woolly Rhinoceros (*Coelodonta Antiquitatis*) grew generally to a length of 12 feet. It had two horns in its skull and a smaller one in between its eyes. All three made of keratin. It had long thick fur, small ears, short, thick legs, and a stocky body. Also, cave drawings suggest a wide dark line between its front and back legs.

Diet:

The Woolly Rhinoceros was an herbivore and ate all types of existing vegetation. In snowy areas they would use their tusks to scrape along the ground to uncover vegetation they could eat.

Habitat:

The Woolly Rhinoceros was native to the northern steppes of Eurasia.
